RELIEF

We assist CPS families and aging-out foster teens monthly with essentials like beds, groceries, rent, utilities, clothing, gas, car seats, and more.

CAMPS

I CAN CAMP: Prepares foster teens for college or trade school, builds trust, and provides tools to break the cycle of abuse with a focus on sobriety, education, and faith.

SEW CAMP

Teaches foster teens to sew and improve focus. Texas aims to replicate this program statewide. www.isewcare

GRADUATION CELEBRATIONS

Our annual party celebrates all foster teen graduates. Those who complete trade school or a college course in high school receive a \$500 gift for securing a trade or free college tuition.

BLUE ZOO DAY

We bring foster children together with siblings from separate homes, fostering better outcomes through sibling connections.

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION SEMINAR

An annual seminar for prevention professionals and South Texas churches, focusing on recognizing and preventing abuse and launching orphan care projects.

HAPPY FAMILIES MATERIALS

Free resources provided to replace fear-driven materials concerning child safety for schools, churches, and health clinics.

CHRISTMAS

We provide gifts and groceries to the poorest CPS families every Christmas.

MONTHLY BROWN BAG LUNCHEON

Brings sister agencies together for a meal, speakers, sharing needs, and prayers.

BACK TO SCHOOL SUPPLIES

We supply school essentials to **500+** abused children annually.
